Abortion Rights and Wrongs by Roland Foster

"Moloch" is believed to be the name of a pagan god to whom children were sacrificed long ago. Generally, in today's world, this is considered an abomination. The idea of sacrificing a family's children, or a nation's children, to appease an angry god is repugnant to most people today.

And yet we — the American people, and indeed the people of almost every nation in the world — willingly, year after year, sacrifice millions of our children (about 63 million in the USA since the Roe v. Wade decision) to four voracious gods. Their names are Pleasure, Irresponsibility, Convenience, and Greed.

Those who are opposed to abortion on demand say that every abortion kills a human being, and that is true. They are right. Remember that word, "right."

Those who are in favor of abortion on demand, and want to continue it, say that it is a matter of "women's reproductive rights" or "women's health." But they are lying, and they know they are lying.

First of all, there can be no "right" to do something that is wrong. Can the government give you a "right" to murder your neighbor? Or steal his or her car, or rape his or her children? Of course not. No thinking person would demand such a right, or support those who clamor for it. Why not? Because such actions are wrong. Exactly as wrong as killing an unborn child.

Abortion advocates always fall back on this refrain: "What about the life or health of the mother? What about rape and incest? What about birth defects?" These are the so-called "hard cases."

A survey^{**} of more than 2.4 million aborting women, performed by the states of Florida, Louisiana, Minnesota, Nebraska, South Dakota and Utah during the years 1996 to 2020, gives us a good estimate of the number of "hard case" abortions, since these are the numbers that abortion clinics must report in official documents to these states:

- 1.14% to save the life or physical health of the mother.
- 1.28% to preserve the mental health of the mother.
- 0.39% in cases of rape or incest.
- 0.69% for fetal birth defects, or eugenics.

The remaining 96.50% of abortions are performed for social or economic reasons.

Even the Guttmacher Institute puts the number of abortions done for the hard cases under 7%, after doing several surveys of women obtaining abortions (the Guttmacher Institute was the research arm of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America, the largest chain of abortion clinics in the United States. It is considered the most reliable provider of accurate statistics on abortion). So for some 93% or 96.5% of elective abortions, "women's health" is not the reason.

Now it is true that in many of the various "hard cases" abortion may be the best of the available alternatives. But let's be clear on this: abortion — killing a baby in the womb — is <u>always</u> an evil. It may in fact sometimes be the least of available evils. It may become medically necessary, but is it never good or "right."

Now let's get back to the four insatiable "gods" to whom we are sacrificing our children. First, Pleasure. Have you heard the phrase, "If it feels good, do it"? Many of our people, particularly young people, have embraced this as a primary ideology. They bound from one pleasure to the next, always seeking "fun." They are being taught constantly by multiple societal pressures that that's how they should live. They are completely deaf to any feeble voices that try to say otherwise.

I am strongly pro-choice. I adamantly believe that if a woman (of whatever age) does not want to become a mother, she can, and in fact she should, <u>choose</u> not to become pregnant. Likewise, if a man (of whatever age) does not want to become a father, he should <u>choose</u> not to impregnate anyone. What is hard to understand about that?

"But," I hear both women and men complaining, "I want to enjoy life. Having sex is fun." Really? Is "having fun" more important than the life of a child?
